- These childcare challenges cost US employers an estimated \$3 billion annually.



LOCAL COMMUNITY EVENT EXAMPLES

In Southeast Indiana, local community leaders hosted a luncheon to learn about the economics of early childhood education and discussed their community need. A video segment of Dr. Tim Bartik's keynote address from the 2017 Indiana Early Learning Summit was presented which gives a national and statewide perspective of the economic return on investing in early childhood education. They shared local data about the current status in their region and had table discussions about possible next steps to address the need.

The Wabash County Early Childhood Education Coalition utilized an op-ed campaign to build community buy-in and excitement about the need for investing in early childhood education. Over the course of three months community leaders, educators, business owners, judge, and others wrote about their personal experiences with the challenges related to the lack of high quality early childhood education programs in the county. These letters were featured weekly in the local paper!
